Ancient Forest Workshop Hall / Forest of Ancient Plants

A zone designed to recreate a Yayoi-period forest. The "Ancient Forest Event Hall" offers various learning and hands-on experiences through interaction with the forest.

Snow Peak GROUNDS YOSHINOGARI

Snow Peak, Starbucks, and Mitsue Chicken Honpo have stores here. There is also a library connecting nature and history.

New West Gate Camp Field

Features cottages modeled after watchtowers and free camping sites overlooking the ruins. (Reservations required)

Yayoi Grand Field

This vast lawn area is ideal for various recreational activities. A ground golf course is available, and equipment can be rented at the Grass Recreational Area. There is also free rental of large play balls.

Grass Recreational Area

Features ten types of playground equipment, including a watchtower-style observation deck, roller slide, multi-play structures, trampolines, and inflatable domes.

Outdoor Cooking Area West Gate Area

Visitors can casually enjoy barbecues while viewing reconstructed buildings.

Petting Zoo

Aquariums display fish and aquatic creatures found in the park. Visitors can also interact with rabbits and Tortoise. Goat feeding experiences are available.

West Gate Service Center

Entrance from the JR Kanzaki Station side. Located near the lawn plaza and playground equipment. Also handles reception for the outdoor cooking area.



North Gate Camp Field

Features cabins modeled after pit dwellings and free or powered campsites overlooking the Seturi Mountains. (Reservations required)

Rows of Burial Jars

Recreates a burial row stretching approximately 300 meters and consisting of about 500 tombs, along with a central burial path.

North Burial Mound

A special burial site from about 2,100 years ago where successive kings and high-ranking individuals were interred. Fourteen jar coffins were excavated from the mound. One contained a bronze sword and glass beads, while seven others contained bronze swords as grave goods.

Storehouses and Market

Believed to have been the trade center of Yoshinogari's ancient state. Thirty-one structures have been reconstructed, including watchtowers for monitoring entry and exit, storage warehouses, and a market tower overseeing trade.

North Inner Enclosure

Considered the most important and sacred area of the Yoshinogari settlement, and believed to have been used for rituals and political ceremonies. Nine buildings have been reconstructed, including a massive ceremonial hall.

South Inner Enclosure

Twenty buildings have been reconstructed, including four watchtowers, residences for kings, and cooking facilities, representing royal living quarters.

Historical Park Center (East Gate)

The park's main gate and entrance from JR Yoshinogari-Koen Station. Facilities include a guidance room, mini theater, rest area, and multipurpose rooms. There is also a restaurant and shop.

South Village

This area was home to common people known as "geko." A total of 27 structures, including pit dwellings and raised-floor storehouses, have been reconstructed.

Yayoi Lifestyle Museum

A guidance and hands-on experience facility for the South Village. At the workshop, visitors can register for programs such as magatama bead-making and fire-making experiences.
